Solar Panels/ Collection

Need to submit

1. Building permit application
 - a. Fill out building application form to completion
 - b. Provide 2 sets of Plat of survey with drawings of what is to be installed and locations with dimensions.
 - c. Provide 2 copies of plans and manufacturers product information; including at minimum,
 - i. transfer switch hook up
 - ii. Provide diagram of piping and components for the connection to the existing service.
 - iii. Provide contact information from ComEd indicating who you have spoken to regarding this installation and who needs to be contacted for final inspection.
 - iv. Provide structural calculations, if applicable

2. Procedure steps
 - a. It is applicant's duty to insure their Homeowners Association (if applicable) written approval before starting work. This is **not** performed by the City of Sandwich.
 - b. Submit everything from above
 - c. Approval will be given/ denied from the building department and applicant will be informed of decision.
 - d. A permit fee of \$75.00 must be paid. (Residential Alterations)
 - e. Provide utility contact information that indicates who applicant has spoken to regarding this installation and who needs to be contacted for a final inspection. All utility inspections are to be arranged and verified by applicant.
 - f. Inspections needed by City of Sandwich. Applicant **MUST** make these calls to set up inspections
 - i. Final inspection/ After equipment is installed and tested.
A qualified person must be onsite during final inspection to explain and answer questions.

All Solar panels/ collectors shall comply with the following standards and regulations.

1. The person accepting the submittal at City Hall will only determine whether all the documentation has been provided and cannot issue the building permit. Do not begin construction before receiving a permit. The penalties for constructing without a building permit are a doubling of the permit fee and the possible court order for removal of the completed work.

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2. Utility easements give the utility companies the right to remove any structure from the easement at the expense of the property owner if maintenance or other work is required. On occasion, it may be necessary for you to obtain written approval from the utility companies before the City issues a building permit.
3. State law requires you to call J.U.L.I.E. (811 or 800-892-0123) before any digging project.
4. No solar collection structures are allowed in front yard.
5. We use the IRC Code 2006 and NEC Code 2005

Miscellaneous:

1. Generally speaking, the front yard is the area between the side property lines and from the front property line to the house foundation. The side yards are the areas from the house foundation to the side property line on both sides of the house. The rear yard would be the area between the side property lines and from the rear property line to the house foundation.
2. Your subdivision may have restrictive covenants that limit or even prohibit solar panels/collectors on your property. It is the owner's sole responsibility to ensure compliance with the covenants.

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
